From the Pastor's Study

Dear Ones of Beulah Presbyterian Church –

February 2010

I just finished reading ***Accompany Them With Singing - The Christian Funeral***, written by one of my seminary professors, Dr. Thomas Long, published by our own Westminster/John Knox Press here in Louisville. For some years when I was in seminary Dr. Long taught at Princeton Seminary, and now he is Professor of Preaching at Candler School of Theology, Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia.

To say a book about Christian Funerals was a real “page turner” sounds strange, I grant you. But for me, it was just that. The book covers the historical development of the funeral, and examines the theological, liturgical, and cultural development of the funeral, especially here in America. He advocates for the recovery of some ancient funeral practices, in which the funeral is structured around a “metaphor of the deceased traveling on a baptismal journey toward God.” And then we, as the community of faith, are to “accompany this saint of God on the last mile of the way.” This is rich text, and will likely guide funeral practice in our own Presbyterian churches and in many other traditions for years to come.

In the chapter title “In The Hour of Our Death,” Tom Long quotes from a sermon preached by Jon Walton, a pastor in New York City (pages 112-113), in which Pastor Jon describes a visit he made to an older woman, a person of deep faith. During their visit he read some of the Psalms to her, and then he describes for this congregation what happened next:

“She told me the doctors explained the diagnosis to her. “Lymphoma, rather advanced.” But she was feeling relieved – it meant there would be no surgery in her weakened condition, and she was thankful for the good care she was getting at the hospital: clean sheets, nurses to attend her, food prepared and served, visits with her son and her pastor...

Then she smiled and said, “I wish you had been here earlier. The doctor came in to see me with three handsome young interns in tow. They told me their names, and each one checked me over, and then the doctor said to me, “Maybe you would like to share with these young men something they should know as doctors, especially in light of your faith and what I told you earlier.”

She said to me, “I hardly knew what to say. It seems like it was so important. Here I was in bed and I was supposed to say something that these young doctors could remember. I didn’t think I had anything to say, so I just said, ‘Somehow I trust that whatever happens to me I will be in God’s hands, and that gives me hope. Whatever happens, I will be all right.’”

And then she looked at me and said, “I wish you’d have been here. You could have said it so much better than I could.”

And I looked at her and I said, “No, I couldn’t. I couldn’t have said it any better at all.”

None of us could say it any better either: *Somehow I trust that whatever happens to me I will be in God’s hands, and that gives me hope. Whatever happens, I will be all right.* In our Brief Statement of Faith, we say it in brief: *In life and in death, we belong to God.* May this good news of the gospel, this trust and hope, be ours in these days, come what may. 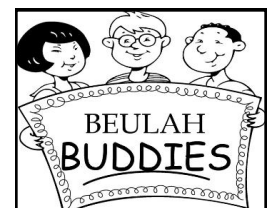

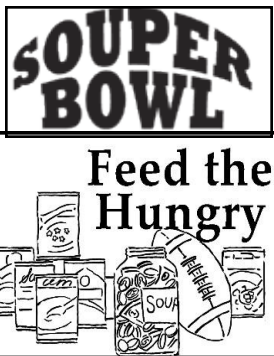

ESL (English as Second Language) Class will begin soon.

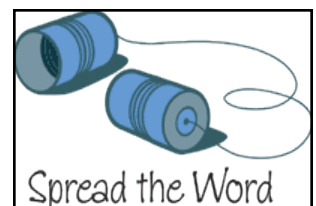
Beulah will sponsor ESL classes again this year on Monday and Wednesday evenings, February 22 through March 31, at 6:00 p.m. in the Ramsey building.

Volunteers are needed for teaching, providing meals and child care. A coordinator for this program is also needed.

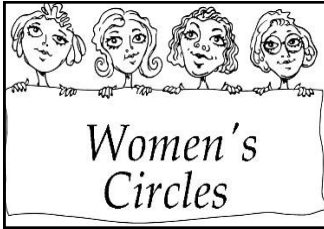

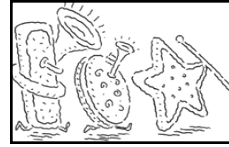

Adult/High School Mission Trip to New Orleans, LA



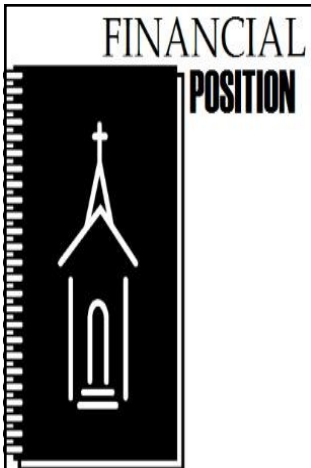
Beulah is planning a mission trip to New Orleans, Louisiana July 11-17.

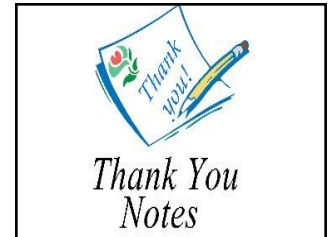

A LETTER FROM MID-KENTUCKY PRESBYTERY

Dear Pastor, Members of Session and the Congregation:

Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ!

Because of your witness to Jesus Christ and your generosity, the following ministries were made possible in 2009 – **and this is not a complete list!**

- Finished Presbytery's Joining Hearts and Hands Campaign. This campaign funded four ministries: new church development, African-American youth and young adult ministry, Hispanic/Latino Ministry, and mission seas.
- Gloria Moorman is in her third year as the African-American Youth and Young Adult Evangelist.
- Rev. Tony Aja began his second year as the Hispanic/Latino Coordinator.
- Rev. Randy Wilcher will begin the Mt. Washington New Church Development in May.
- Completed 2/3 of the ACTS Initiative three year journey with the Rev. Stan Ott. Eighteen congregations are learning to be intentional about the inward/outward journey of deepening faith inside the church while developing a heart for evangelism for those outside the church.
- Guided 7 congregations through *Unbinding the Gospel* by Martha Grace Reese.
- Continued the emphasis as a Presbytery on *Growing the Church Deep and Wide*. Presbytery meetings focused on evangelism, discipleship, service, and diversity.
- Began a year-long emphasis on prayer that is being integrated into Committee and Unit work as well as other areas of Presbytery.
- Chartered a new church, Louisville Taiwanese Presbyterian Church, in October.
- Assisted 7 congregations in calling new clergy through the Committee on Ministry.
- Held two educational events: PARTI and Leader Development Day.
- Evaluated the Presbytery-wide youth activities with the goal of improving our offerings to congregations and reaching more youth.
- Hosted a pastor from Chang-Hua Presbytery, Taiwan, for the Presbyterian Women's Gathering.
- Assisted many of the churches in the Presbytery with resources from LARC. Curriculum choices, worship planning, adult education and stewardship campaigns were easier with materials from LARC. Welcomed patrons with a warm bowl of soup on Wednesdays before Lent. Lived up to our slogan "LARC is your Helping Hand in Ministry."
- Supported 20 inquirers and candidates for ministry with guidance, counsel and prayer, and by providing 8 scholarships for seminary expenses.
- Provided scholarships for educators, pastors, and church volunteers to attend educational events and national conferences.
- Provided encouragement and staff support for Older Adult Ministries and PHSK Friends (the Presbytery's liaisons to Presbyterian Homes and Services of KY).
- Worked with sister presbyteries in the Synod of Living Waters to provide scholarships and support for the 2010 Association of Presbyterian Educators' conference in Nashville.
- Participated in ecumenical/interfaith events such as Festival of Faiths and Kentucky Council of Churches Annual Assembly, as well as co-sponsoring the Interfaith Community Hunger Walk.
- Continued support of campus ministry through the Kentucky Campus Ministry Board and the University of Louisville campus ministry program; revised a new initiative for reaching college-age adults and called a new campus minister to oversee the initiative.
- Continued to rebuild lives in and around Gautier, Mississippi due to Hurricane Katrina.
- Contributed \$13,000 to Covenant Community Church.



Mid-KY Presbytery Letter (continued)

- Found grant money in the amount of \$3,796 for both the multi-cultural ministry at Beechmont Presbyterian Church and the Hispanic/Latino tutoring ministry at Shelbyville First Presbyterian.
- Contracted with MissionInsite to secured demographic information for every church for \$1,135 a year.
- Contributed \$34,650 to Camp Cedar Ridge, which provided financial resources to serve over 22,000 children and adults!
- Contributed \$18,750 to Presbyterian Community Center.
- Contributed \$75,289 to the ministry and mission of the PC(USA) along with 173 other presbyteries.
- Contributed \$19,813 to the ministry and mission of the Synod of Living Waters.

Everything we do together is made possible because of the gifts from congregations. Less than 1% of Presbytery's budget comes from investment or reserve accounts. Only 1% comes from individual gifts for specific purposes.

Your Per Capita pays for basic administrative expenses: \$116,157 remained in the Presbytery, \$57,534 was sent to the General Assembly, and \$33,613 was sent to the Synod of Living Waters.

I thank you for your generosity and commitment to this ministry. Our dollars were given to us by God. You shared your gifts with more than 9,923 Presbyterians in the Presbytery from LaGrange to Glasgow and Frankfort to Guston.
