From the Pastor's Study

March 2010

O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth shall declare your praise. - Psalm 51:15

With these words the writer of this Psalm engages in an ancient practice - perhaps the most ancient practice of any religious people. These words form a prayer. Addressed to God, the Lord, these words ask something of God. We could say that any words (even profane words) addressed to God, can be viewed as a prayer.

According to Dr. Martha Moore-Keish, a professor of theology at Columbia Seminary (one of our PCUSA seminaries), these words from Psalm 51 have been used in services of Morning Prayer in monasteries across the Western Church since the early Middle Ages (beginning in the 5th century), up to this day. Services of Morning Prayer today, in Roman Catholic, Episcopalian, Presbyterian, Lutheran, and many other Protestant churches, use these same words – often in a “leader / people” call and response liturgy, as we often do in our Call to Worship on Sunday mornings:

One: O Lord, open my lips,

All: and my mouth shall declare your praise.

These ancient words are also the very first words spoken in these Morning Prayer services. They begin the day.

In her book *Christian Prayer for Today*, (Westminster / John Knox Press, 2009), Dr. Moore-Keish states that this prayer, with its origins in the prayer life of the people of ancient Israel, “*is particularly powerful when these are the first words of the day, after keeping silence for the night – whether in a monastery or family home. These words acknowledge that God gives and receives our words, both empowers our prayers and is the goal of our prayers.*”

I shutter to think when I recall some of the first words, or the first thoughts, that are on my mind when I first wake up in the morning, after keeping silence for the night. At times they are addressed to God, for sure – but they are words of groaning: *O God, I need more sleep! Why did I stay up so late last night?* Sometimes they are words of complaint: *O Lord, I've got way too much to do today!* Or there are no words or thoughts at all; I simply make a straight line to the kitchen to make coffee.

During these days of Lent, when we are encouraged to slow down a bit, and focus more intentionally on the disciplines of our faith – like prayer – one way to focus this discipline would be to begin the day with this simple prayer. After keeping silence while we slept, what if our first words every morning were not words of complaint or groaning or a numbed existence, but instead the words of this ancient prayer? As we rouse ourselves from sleep, before we even leave our beds, how much better would each day be for us if we began with acknowledging God – who empowers our prayers, is the goal of our prayers, and the One who is giving us this new day of life as a gift?

I want to invite you to join me – and for us together to join the millions who over the centuries have engaged in this very ancient practice of beginning the day with these words of prayer. This common participation is part of the Communion of the Saints (past and present) - and that itself is powerful. This prayer can focus our day, and keep us on the path of right living. After this brief, personal morning prayer, we can then do as Martin Luther suggests: “Then go joyfully to your work....”

Praying and worshipping and serving with you in these days of Lent, I remain,

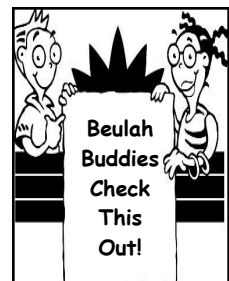

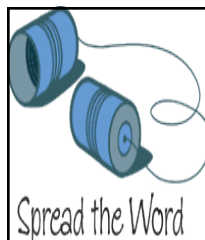

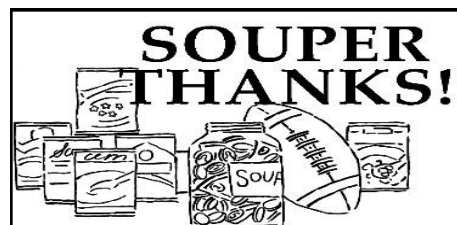

Flowering of the Cross

Last year Beulah Church began a tradition called "Flowering of the Cross" for Easter Sunday.

This is an especially striking and beautiful way to symbolize the new life that is ours through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the tomb.

Children and adults are asked to bring fresh flowers (if possible),

purchased or from gardens, or artificial flowers and place them on the wooden cross which will be located in the church lobby on Easter Sunday morning.

The cross, covered with flowers will then be moved to the front of our sanctuary during the singing of the first hymn.

Many have claimed the Flowering of the Cross has been traced back to the 6th century. It reminds us of how Jesus took an emblem of shame and turned it into a badge of glory. Jesus can truly turn our barren crosses in life into something beautiful.

Dewey: There's a Cat in the Library! by Vicki Myron and Brett Witter is a delightful **children's** book based on the best-selling true story of a kitten found in the drop slot of the public library on the coldest night of the year. Named Dewey Readmore Books, the kitten enjoys many adventures as he becomes the purr-fect library cat.

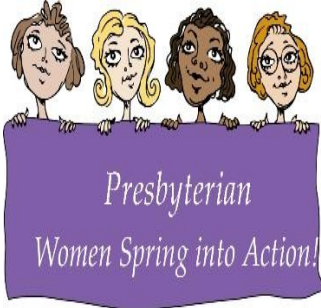
Coming Home (large print) by Rosamunde Pilcher is a pre-WW II novel set in Cornwall and details the coming of age of Judith Dunbar who is left behind at an English boarding school while her mother and baby sister join her father in Singapore. An unlikely acquaintance with Loveday Carey-Lewis penetrates Judith's misery and leads her into an understanding of values, friendship and wealth. Then World War II brings lessons of courage for Judith.

The Face on the Milk Carton by Caroline B. Cooney is a **young adult** novel first published in 1990. Janie is a 15 year-old high school student who one day at lunch looks at the missing child picture on her friend's milk carton and recognizes herself. Although Janie begins to have flashbacks, she cannot believe that her parents were kidnappers.

All four books in the Janie Johnson series are available for your checkout.

At Home in Mitford by Jan Karon is the beginning story of Father Tim, a sixty year-old Episcopal clergyman and a cast of entertaining characters including his wild dog Barnabas who becomes docile in response to scripture. Meet new neighbor Cynthia, who asks Fr. Tim to go steady; his secretary who treats him as if he's 10 years old; and Dooley, a wild mountain boy.

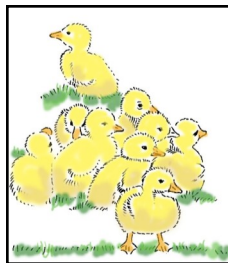

Heifer Project benefits from PW Cookie Walk

As you already know from previous *Beulah* articles, the Heifer Project received \$500 from the Tenth Annual Cookie Walk last December. We were able to purchase 3 goats and 7 flocks of chicks.



A starter flock of chicks and training in their care is an especially effective way to help families escape chronic poverty and hunger. Since chickens require very little space, eat low-cost feed and can lay more than 200 eggs a year, they are often a perfect fit for families living in the most extreme poverty. Because they are packed with protein, iron and zinc, each egg can become a lifesaving gift for a malnourished child.

Goats are also a good solution for a hungry family and don't require large tracts of land. Goats can provide up to a gallon of rich, nutritious milk each day. Since goats can thrive on the plants and leaves that other livestock cannot eat, they help families flourish when resources are limited.

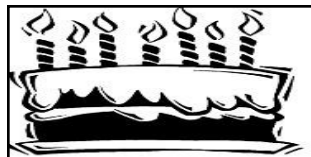
Sign up early in the lobby to bring either SALAD or VEGETABLE.

The first Presbyterian Women Birthday party began in 1922 and helped celebrate worthy causes around the world. This year, the 2010 Birthday Offering will celebrate two exciting ministries:

 • **Kindergarten and Childcare Center - Kirkuk, Iraq** provides high quality education to children, teaching basic skills in a loving environment. The center is operated under Christian principles of love, peace, tolerance and nonviolence. It is a welcome institution in its Middle Eastern context. Requests for enrollment far exceed its current capacity of 150 students. The current kindergarten building is now for sale. The Birthday Offering grant will help fund the purchase of this building and a neighboring building to house the primary school. More children and their families will benefit from the faithful education at this center.

 • **Peace Presbyterian Church R.I.S.E. (Reach-Improve-Strengthen-Empower) Project - Louisville** - Peace Presbyterian Church works to be a beacon of light in the Newburg community by providing services specifically to children, youth, adults and families identified as at-risk or in need of support during a transitional period. The Birthday Offering grant will strengthen the church's outreach in the community by expanding the number of people being served by their four educational or family service opportunities.

- defensive driving techniques, new traffic laws and rules of the road;

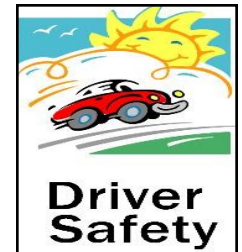
- adjust driving to age-related changes in vision, hearing and reaction time.

Sing the Faith: New Hymns for Presbyterians features a unique collection of hymn selections and styles designed to complement The Presbyterian Hymnal and to give music leaders more choices of songs.

Sing the Faith includes favorite songs by Presbyterians not included in The Presbyterian Hymnal: traditional hymns; world music from Europe, Africa, and Asia; African American and Hispanic American music; liturgical chants from the Taize community; plus more contemporary contributions such as 'Awesome God' and 'Sanctuary.'

For the past several months we have been copying hymns and songs from this supplemental hymnal, using our Christian Copyright License Incorporated (CCLI) for permission to make these copies. Now we would like to purchase this supplemental hymnal for our use. A copy of this hymnal is available for review in the church lobby.

The Session has authorized the purchase of this new supplemental hymnal for our worship services here at Beulah, for use with our current Presbyterian Hymnal. And we are seeking donations to purchase these additional hymnals!
