From the Pastor's Study

Dear Beulah Church Family,

September 2010

In the Book of Acts, chapter 17, the Apostle Paul is preaching before a group of people in the Greek city of Athens. He begins his sermon with these words:

*Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way.
For as I went through the city,
and looked carefully at the objects of your worship,
I found among them an altar with the inscription, "To an unknown god."
What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you... (Acts 17:22-23)*

In that sermon Paul goes on to tell about God, who made everything, including us, and about Jesus Christ, "whom God raised from the dead."

I thought of this sermon, particularly the opening words ("how extremely religious" the people were) because I believe this is also true about you and me. Like the ancient Athenians, we are "extremely religious." The sheer number of churches, synagogues, mosques, temples, schools and other institutions in our country associated with various religions, the number of believers, the amount of time, talent, and money given to carry out God's ministry and mission in the world – all of this supports the premise of how "extremely religious" we all are.

Consider too the passionate rhetoric we often hear when it comes to religion, particularly when one form of religion bumps up against another form of religion.

We have been overwhelmed these days with news stories about the proposal to build a Muslim community center within a few blocks of Ground Zero in New York City, the site of the World Trade Center, destroyed on 9/11/2001, killing thousands of people (including people of various religions – Christians, Jews, and Muslims). Because the terrorists who carried out this terrible attack called themselves Muslims, some believe putting a Muslim place of worship (called a mosque) this close to Ground Zero would be an affront to the memory of those who were killed there.

All manner of people have raised concerns over this, arguing about the religious freedoms in country, legal concerns, respect and sensitivity matters when it comes to that particular land, viewed by many as "hallowed ground." Here again, note the religious language used around this entire matter, with some of the language, sadly, stoking fear and fire rather than information and spirited discussion.

As for me, I count myself among those who believe the mosque can and should be built on the proposed location in New York City. I read in the news that there is already another mosque within the same radius to Ground Zero, which has been there for over 40 years. I suspect a good part of the opposition to this is based on fear and a lack of understanding of the Muslim faith, a religion followed by over one billion people around the world. I also see similarities between the "Muslims" who perpetrated the 9/11 attacks to the "Christians" who are members of the Klu Klux Klan who perpetrated much violence on African Americans and others in decades past. Both are extremist groups, using the good name of a religion, using "proof-texts" from sacred writings, all to justify their violent desires and methods. And both are on the wrong side of genuine religion and faith.

I wonder... if there was a proposal to build a mosque closer to us here, say along Bardstown Road in Fern Creek, what would the local reaction be? Something to think about.

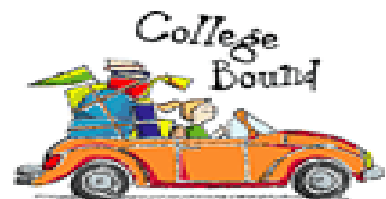
College Connection Begins Again!

PW would like to do that. Do come and join one of the circles and enjoy the fellowship they provide.

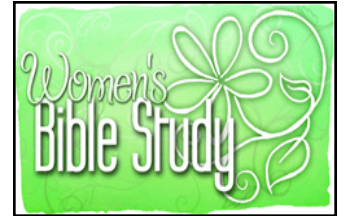
If you have been thinking of joining a circle, now would be a great time to

Come, let us study, agree, disagree, discuss and try to understand that Revelation is, in the end, a message of hope.



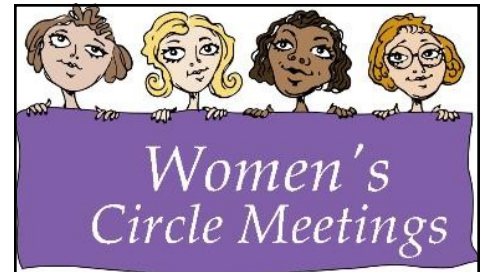

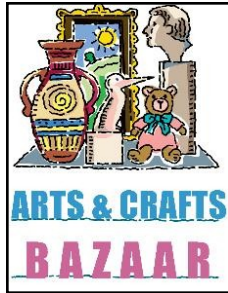

"Beulah's art group will resume on the second Thursday of each month, beginning September 9, from 6:30 to 8:30, in the Fireside Room, Ramsey building.

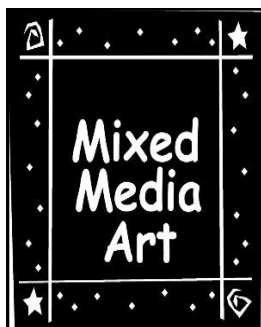
This group is for anyone who likes to be creative with scissors, glue, paint, stamps and other art media.

vacation this year, check your luggage to make sure I'm not hiding in it!

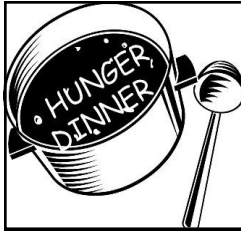
